What does this mean?

1. When you park your car, and you don't see a parking meter, you should:

## Using a parking kiosk

$\qquad$ Press print
$\qquad$ Choose the time you want to park
$\qquad$ Put money or credit card in
$\qquad$ Put paper in windshield

## Using the parking app

$\qquad$ Create an account with your cell phone number. You need to have a credit card
$\qquad$ Put in how long you want to park, your license plate, and the "zone" number for the place you're parking (It's on parking sign)
$\qquad$ Download the app from Google Play or the Apple Store
$\qquad$ Pay for your parking from your phone with a credit card

## MATH:

You cannot park closer than ten feet to a fire hydrant, or twenty feet from the middle of a crosswalk, or twenty-five feet from an intersection. How many meters are these?
One foot = . 3048 meter. Formula: Divide by 3.281 or just 3 for an estimate.
If you park less than five feet from a driveway, the driveway owner can call the police to ticket you. How many meters is five feet?

EXTRA CREDIT:
You have to park less than
18 inches from the curb or you might get a ticket.

1 inch = 2.54 cm Formula:
Multiply inches by 2.54
