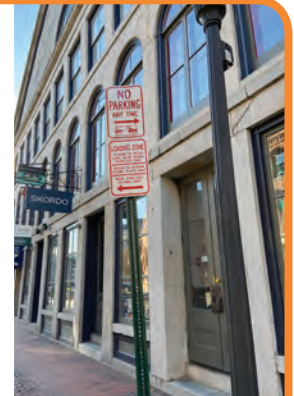

What does this mean?

1. **When you park your car, and you don't see a parking meter, you should:**
 - a. Assume parking is free
 - b. Check to see if there is a parking kiosk nearby where you can obtain a ticket
 - c. Check to see if there are any signs giving you information about parking

2. **What are the rules for parking in front of a fire hydrant?**
 - a. You can never park in front of a fire hydrant, because fire trucks need easy access to fire hydrants to connect their hoses to water

Using a parking kiosk

- ___ Press print
- ___ Choose the time you want to park
- ___ Put money or credit card in
- ___ Put paper in windshield

Using the parking app

- ___ Create an account with your cell phone number. You need to have a credit card
- ___ Put in how long you want to park, your license plate, and the “zone” number for the place you’re parking (It’s on parking sign)
- ___ Download the app from Google Play or the Apple Store
- ___ Pay for your parking from your phone with a credit card

MATH:

You cannot park closer than ten feet to a fire hydrant, or twenty feet from the middle of a crosswalk, or twenty-five feet from an intersection. How many meters are these?

One foot = .3048 meter. **Formula: Divide by 3.281 or just 3 for an estimate.**

If you park less than five feet from a driveway, the driveway owner can call the police to ticket you. How many meters is five feet?

DISCUSSION:

- If you had a car in your country, what was different from here? Did you get tickets if you parked in the wrong place?
- Do you usually have birthday parties for children in your country? Why or why not? If so, what birthdays are important – a child turning one, two or three? Have you been to a child’s birthday party in the U.S.?



EXTRA CREDIT:

You have to park less than 18 inches from the curb or you might get a ticket.

1 inch = 2.54 cm Formula:
Multiply inches by 2.54
